Advent Sermon Series and Study "Hail the Heaven Born"

Why not make this Christmas season extra special by getting involved in the Havelock Church Advent Study during the month of December. Here's how you can participate:

- (1) Purchase the study book "Hail the Heaven Born" written by Kevin Baker. There is a brief chapter to read each week during December. Cost: \$6.50. Orders will be taken on Sunday mornings beginning November 18th or by calling the church office at 466-6736.
- (2) Come on Sunday morning to worship where Pastor Chuck will present a message from the Scripture text, which is the focus of the week's study.
- (3) Remain after worship for a small group discussion in Fellowship Hall of the chapter for that week.

The introduction to this Advent study tells about a man's reaction to a new highway that is being built in his small

community and how things will never be the same again. The question for the community was how to prepare for the changes that would come.

The study then looks at the gospels as John the Baptist announces, "prepare the way of the Lord". We will be led into a look at the sights and sounds of the advent season and into a deeper reflection on the questions: "Are we prepare the way of the Lord, how will our lives change?" "How can we discover renewed hope and power in the presence of Jesus Christ?"
