PASTOR'S NOTE

LISTENING TO GOD: A STUDY FOR LENT

Each year, in preparation for the celebration of Easter, Christians enter a season of devotion and drawing closer to God through the practice of prayer, fasting, self-examination and the study of Scripture. This year the Havelock Church will be offering a study of prayer entitled, "Listening to God".

The purpose of this study will be twofold: (1) To examine the teachings of Jesus and the New Testament on prayer in a way that challenges us to dialogue with God. This dialogue will involve listening as well as asking or speaking to God; (2) To enhance the observation of Lent by enabling us to set ourselves apart in prayer and self-examination for the 40 days prior to Easter.

The study will be a combination of lecture and discussion. Content will be presented followed by discussion within the group. Each week there will be a group prayer exercise conducted in the chapel which will be designed to enhance the prayer life of those who participate.

This five-week study will begin on Wednesday, March 16th, 5:45 – 7:00 pm in the Friendship Parlor and will be led by Pastor Chuck. On the first night of the study (March 16th) bring a sack meal. The group will decide on the possibility of sharing meals for the rest of the sessions.

Week One:	"The Motive for Prayer"	(Matthew 6:1-5)
Week Two:	"Centering Prayer"	(Matthew 6:6-9)
Week Three:	"The Content of Prayer"	(Matthew 6:10-14)
Week Four:	"Reprogramming Our Minds in Prayer"	(Matthew 6:19-24; Romans 12:2)
Week Five:	"Prayer in Action"	(1 Thessalonians 5:17; Ephesians 6:18; Romans 8:26)

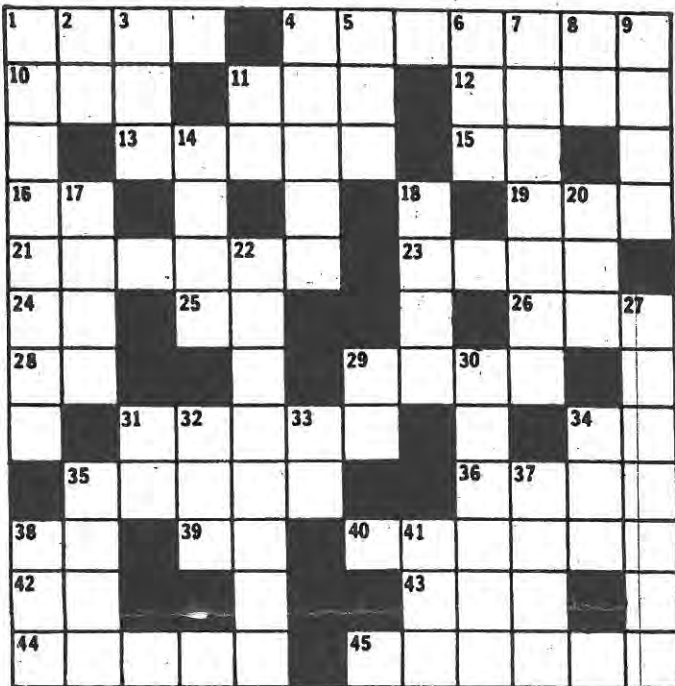

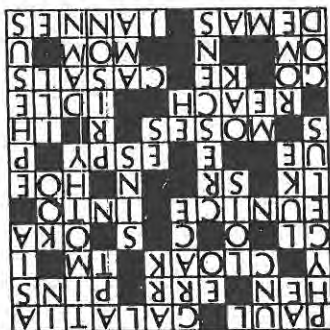

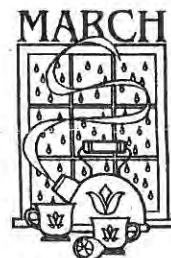

"Same Kind of Different As Me" by Ron Hall & Denver Moore

This is a very fascinating story of the lives of these two men, beginning with their sharing something about what their life was like as young boys to the present. Ron is a white man who grew up in Texas and Denver is a black man who grew up in Louisiana. This impelling story reminds everyone very vividly that even today slavery exists, we just may choose to call it something else. Ron & Denver meet as adults and through the urging of Ron's wife she helps the two men form a very close bond. This story will make you cry as well as give you something to smile about. It also will give you much to think about and hopefully cause you to look at persons who are struggling in a new light. *But for the grace of God, there go I.*"

"Connected Wisdom" by Linda Booth Sweeney

This book shares how the actions of one thing affects another, focusing on our environment. The author has chosen to write this in a unique way. She has 2 or 3 pages about a particular subject and then follows it with a lesser known fable to help illustrate her point. In the back of the book she shares a little bit more about the fables. This is a quick read and very beautifully illustrated. It would be a good one to share with children.

The United Methodist Women's program reading has always been designed to give one a wide variety of material to become educated about. The books are always on topics that are of great importance. They also challenge you to re-think many times how you view a particular subject. You may find yourself changing how you feel about something by the time you have finished reading a book.
