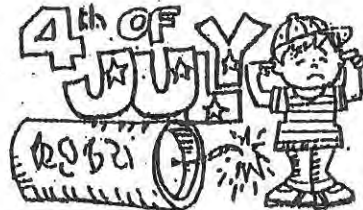
MOVIE NIGHT IN THE COURTYARD

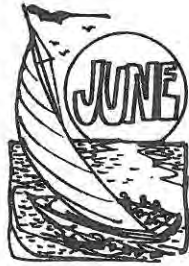

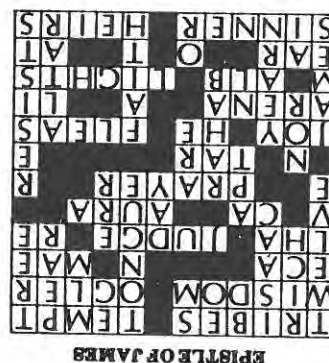
