PASTOR'S NOTE

SABBATH

Most Christians think of Sabbath as Sunday, the first day of the week or the "Lord's Day", the day of the week that Jesus rose from the dead. We know that in the Old Testament the Sabbath was celebrated beginning at 6 pm on Friday until 6 pm on Saturday. It was not just a day off work, but a sacred commandment where the Jewish nation rested from all labor and honored the God of Israel.

The core of Sabbath was rest, renewal and worship. We do not often think of worship as rest (except when sleeping during the sermon). Rest was a key component of the idea of Sabbath in the commandment "You shall honor the Sabbath day and keep it holy."

How can we find this Sabbath rest in our time? It seems like Sundays become a less likely time to rest with so many having to work on Sundays and with all the sporting events for kids. It seems like Sunday is just another busy day.

I believe in our time we must take Sabbath where we can find it and that if we are to have it we will need to be intentional about making time for Sabbath. Stella and I are attempting to do that with a camping trip to the Black Hills of South Dakota. We plan on resting, reading, and doing what we can to give our bodies and spirits a break. We chose the Black Hills as it is a place where we can connect with God. The Native Americans consider this land as sacred and I can understand why as it seems as though God's Spirit moves through those beautiful hills and valleys.

Vacations are not the only way to find Sabbath rest. The old hymn "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" instructs us that we have a God and a fellowship of believers that we can depend on and in which we find rest.

To have the kind of rest that God intends for us we have to find Sabbath in each and every day. We can do this each day when we find a time to set aside and be reminded that God is in charge no matter what comes our way.

I pray that each of you are having a peaceful summer and are finding opportunities for rest. Most of all I pray that the Holy Spirit bring to you the reality of God's rest - the realization that we have an opportunity for Sabbath at anytime by turning over our cares and anxieties to the God who is in control.
