PASTOR'S NOTE

WILDERNESS: "THE IN-BETWEEN TIMES"

It has been said that if Moses had been a woman the Israelites would have arrived in the Promised Land in 40 days instead of 40 years because she would have stopped and asked for directions.

While humorous, this little story highlights our need to find simple effective solutions to the complex challenges that face us in our churches. What makes us extremely uncomfortable is that most of the major problems we face as a church do not have simple, clear solutions.

The fact is that the Israelites probably could have arrived in the Promised Land in 40 days if they would have taken a straight, direct path. The problem would have been that they would have arrived still having a "slave" mentality. It took the 40 years in the wilderness to harden them and condition them with the survival skills it took to be the warriors who eventually conquered the land God had promised them. The wilderness was their "in-between times". In-between Egypt and the Promised Land and in-between being slaves and conquerors.

Gilbert Rendle in his book Leading Change in the Congregation says that the entire Christian Church today has entered the "In-between" Times. The things that we once did that made the church thrive for the most part don't work like they once did throwing us into the chaos of the wilderness. There won't be a direct path to success but the "wilderness" provides us with the opportunity and possibility of a new time and a new model for church and ministry. The problem is we don't know what it looks like or even how to get there – yet!

What we can do is hold on and not give into the fear of not knowing what comes next. As God led the Hebrews through the wilderness, we can also hold on and allow the future to emerge.

Eventually the church will get through the chaos and be stronger than ever. It has before and will again. The Methodist Church, for the most part, has followed a model of ministry developed by John Wesley over 250 years ago. It replaced an old model in the Church of England that was no longer effective. We are finding today that our church model is not getting the response it has in the past. If we are faithful and hold on, we will adapt to a changing culture and environment and find new models of ministry.

Some of us, like Moses, will die in the wilderness before the new model fully emerges. We live during the "In-between Times". If we can accept this and not give into fear, we can appreciate the excitement of learning the skills we need and passing them on as we create a new model for ministry.

FINANCIAL REPORT SEPTEMBER 26, 2011

Operating Budget Needs Year to Date for 2011	\$80,496
Receipts Year to Date	\$70,858
Shortfall:	\$ 9,638

The above does not include apportionments paid to the Annual Conference and is our operations budget only. As you can see we have a significant shortfall in our budget. The 2011 budget was less than our 2010 Budget which paints even a more severe picture of a deficit budget. Our weekly operations budget need is \$2064 per week. Last week's offering was less than \$800.

We know times are difficult and some of our members have reduced their giving to the church. There are various reasons for the reduced giving but some may think that the Havelock Church in not in need of the money. In the past two years we have paid 100% of our apportionments to the annual conference, put a new roof on the church, added additional air-conditioning in the Sanctuary and put carpeting in our entrance and hall way which replaced the unsightly broken tiles. Most of the cost was taken from savings that were sitting idle and not accruing much interest.

If the fiscal picture at the Havelock Church does not turn around soon, there will be drastic cuts in how we operate as a church. I ask you to prayerfully consider your giving and commitment to the church.
