PASTOR'S NOTE

JOURNEY TO HOPE BEGINS

This Lenten season you are invited to go on A Journey to Hope as we travel with Jesus to the cross, discovering along the way that Hope can be found even as we encounter some of life's most difficult circumstances.

This journey is intended for people of all ages and for people within the church community as well as folks in our larger community. This journey will include a sermon series that began on Ash Wednesday and a Bible study that will begin Wednesday, February 29th at 7:00 pm. There will be age appropriate groups and activities for all ages, children, youth and adults. By addressing real life circumstances along the way (i.e. relationships, self-esteem, work, temptation, money problems, suffering and death), those on the journey learn how faith in Christ is relevant to e /eryday life and how having a faith community can make all the difference.

Weekly "Stops" on the Journey (Sermon Topics & Bible Study Topics)

Week One: Who is on this journey with you? How can people encourage or discourage you when the going gets tough? This segment focuses on the importance of developing faith friendships and learning how to lean on Christ as the ultimate Friend.

Week Two: Identity and self-esteem can make or break the journey. Do you base your identity on who people say you are, or who you know God created you to be? Finding a firm foundation in who you are called to be will help in overcoming obstacles.

Week Three: We rely on work to meet the financial needs we incur on the journey. How can work become a joyful destination? Sometimes we sacrifice our passions in life to work for "things". How do we find balance?

Week Four: We get tired along the way and it is tempting to stop or turn around. To go the distance, we must learn how to "refuel". On our journey we will need to identify "refueling stations".

Week Five: Money is a means of exchange for something that we want or need. Any journey requires "purchases" along the way. Do you have a healthy relationship with money?

Week Six: On Palm/Passion Sunday, we will "flashback" to the accolades which were given to Christ upon His triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Would we have started this journey if we realized the pain along the way? When hope seems most elusive, it often is just around the bend.
