PASTOR'S NOTE

ROLLING WITH THE CHANGES IN 2013

The United Methodist Church in Nebraska and throughout the country is facing significant change. Some of these changes are by choice, but a majority of the changes are the result of our changing culture and world.

"We Are Rolling with the Changes" was the theme of the Blue River District Annual Fall Update. The Havelock Church is one of over 60 churches in the Blue River District of the Nebraska Annual Conference. One significant change discussed was the creation of the new Great Plains Annual Conference. The Nebraska Annual Conference will join with the Kansas East and Kansas West Conferences to form one conference on January 1, 2014. The details of how this will happen will be decided at a Uniting Conference in Salina, Kansas scheduled for August 22-24, 2013. The last Nebraska Annual Conference is scheduled for June 5-8, 2013 at St. Mark's United Methodist Church in Lincoln.

In order to measure how we are "rolling with the changes", during 2012 each church in the Nebraska Annual Conference has been entering information each week into a "Vital Signs" database. During the fall update it was announced that on the basis of the information gathered, the Havelock United Methodist Church was one of several churches in the District that were identified to have excellent potential for growth and expanded ministry. The Blue River District and the Conference will be providing direction and resources to help realize this potential during 2013.

Our community is our mission field. Following is a description of our mission field, our vision of reaching out to our community (mission field) and our main goals for 2013:

Description of the Mission Field that the Congregation Serves

The Havelock Church serves a community that consists of older single-family homes. Also in the community are several assisted living facilities and halfway houses for the mentally ill and addicted. The community has an extremely low Non-Anglo population. 30% of the community is Generation X (1965-1980) followed by 26% Millennial's (1981-2000) and 22% Boomers (1946-1964). Middle American families comprise 66% of the community, families being mixed between two-parent families and single-parent families.

The Havelock Church is underrepresented in the Generation X and Millennial groups. The church has experienced the loss of many in the Silent Generation through death which accounts for most of the reduction in membership of the church.

Congregation's Vision Statement

Our mission is to provide a spiritual community of loving friends growing together in God's truth and reaching out to those in need.

Mission Goals

- 1. Increase worship attendance by enhancing heartwarming worship.
- Increase attendance in children's and youth ministries by re-visioning these ministries, eg. Sidewalk Sunday School/VBS etc.
- Provide recreational activities for families in the community thereby introducing them to the Havelock Church.
- Provide affordable professional counseling services to the community through a partnership with Choices Treatment Center
- Develop plans to use unused space at the church to meet both the felt needs of the community and the needs of the church.
- Provide for spiritual growth of the congregation through systematic faith development accomplished by study of scripture and spiritual formation.

Together we can transform the changes into opportunities as we together make disciples of Jesus Christ.
