Dear Friends in Christ, Revelations 5:1-14 says: “Then I looked and I heard the voice of many angels surrounding the throne and the living creatures and the elders; they numbered ten thousand times ten thousand and thousands of thousands, singing with full voice, “Worthy is the Lamb that was slaughtered to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!” Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them singing, “To the one seated on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!” And the four living creatures said, “Amen!” and the elders fell down and worshiped.”

## ALPHA

ALPHA – meeting September 8<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> & 22<sup>nd</sup>

On August 18<sup>th</sup> we began a series called Alpha. We had around 30 people at our first night. We ate the great supper, engineered by Sandy Carlson, saw and heard a great video called “Is There More to Life than This? Had wonderful discussion times with 3 smaller groups in separate rooms. People really seemed to enjoy it. It generated great ideas about faith and what life is all about. One person in my group wants to be baptized, and commit her life to Jesus Christ.

Alpha is the first letter in the Greek alphabet, the language of the New Testament. Alpha focuses on the basics of Christianity, the why I believe what I believe. It features a former atheist Nicky Gumble, who understands the questions we have about our basic beliefs. In September we’ll deal with questions like “Why Did Jesus Die?” “How Can We Have Faith?” and “Why and How Do I Pray?”

The symbol of Alpha is the question mark. There are no dumb questions. Everyone is treated with respect. Alpha is a fun night with a free supper, a DVD presentation that will make you laugh and cry and think more deeply about your faith. This is followed by group discussion where questions are encouraged.

If you missed the first one or two nights, you’re still very welcome to join us for any of the sessions coming up. Supper is at 5:30 p.m. with a discussion group to follow around 6 p.m. Ask the people who have attended what they think about it. I’m sure they will be glad to see you come.

### LIFE LINE SCREENING
