LOVING PRESENCE

It is amazing to realize that we are facing a new year. We have all felt that the last three years were very strange. The pandemic has given us lots of traumatic memories. Yet here the issue is that we do not have to be bound or locked up with the memories.

The book of Leviticus introduces Jubilee as a part of the Law. The jubilee is a utopia-like concept that is hard to find in today's social and economic principles. However, the spirit of the kingdom of God is contained in this. If you look at the whole of Leviticus 25:23, it looks like this, "The land shall not be sold in perpetuity, for the land is mine; with me, you are but aliens and tenants." Jubilee is 'Jobel' in Hebrew, which means 'the sound of a horn.' It was named like that because it was the year of blowing the trumpet and proclaiming the joy of freedom. As the year of liberation, which returns every 50 years, all slaves are freed, all possessions are returned to their original owners, and all lands are followed (Lev. 25:10). The word 'jubilee' in modern English meaning 'delight' and 'festival' comes from this backdrop.

Liberation is highly related to restoration, which is interlocked with time flow. God gave us the image and beauty of God with free will. However, their qualities and values are continuously damaged while we are living in the world, enslaved by the values of the world in fear. Nonetheless, we are regularly facing a new year, passing by our past under God's providence so that we may experience the liberation and restoration of God with a new start, which is the reminder of Jubilee. We don't need to be bound to the past but go forward to tomorrow with the hope of God.

Are we still fastened to our past, especially traumatic times, our loss, our failures, our broken relationships, and so on? Through facing a new year, I hope and pray that we are going to experience God's liberation and restoration. In this, our painful and traumatized memories from the pandemic will be the past. Instead, let us have expectations about what God's blessings for us will be.

Christmas is the visible sign of God's liberation and restoration. The word of God came to the world within a human body. Jesus came to us because of your liberation and restoration.

Listen to the word of Jesus. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor..." Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." (Luke 4:18-19, 21)

In December, shall we share this great news of Jesus Christ?
