Tuesday afternoons at Havelock are a flurry of activity. Fruits and vegetables, breads, donuts and other pastries are set out on tables along with a variety of other food items (artichokes, anyone?). Volunteers set out meats and milk products, counting the total number of items so we give out the right amount to each person coming through the line.

Then the doors are opened an our quests arrive, but only after a prayer of praise and thanksgiving is raised up to God. Our prayers often refer to Jesus' miracle of loaves and fishes, depending on the amount of food we have to give away.

Thank you to each and every one of you who support our FoodNet, either by your presence or your gift of plastic containers, or your prayers. A special thank you goes to Ron Pape for his dedication to cleaning up all of our messes each week. Because of your support, we serve an average of over 100 individuals each week. Many of those have children, which mean we may touch over 200 people.

With the volume of food donations that have to be repackaged, we regularly need plastic containers -- the size of cool whip, margarine or cottage cheese containers. Those can be brought to the kitchen anytime you're in the neighborhood.

May God continue to bless our church through its involvement in the FoodNet program, and allow us to reach out to others in Christ's name.

# **Christianity and World Religions A Church Wide Study**

We live in a diverse and changing world. Around the globe and in our own neighborhoods we live and work with people of other faiths. What do they believe? How, as Christians, should we respond to them? How can we learn about their faiths and share our own faith with respect, building bridges of mutual understanding?

The Havelock Church is focusing on the subject of "Christianity and World Religions." Wrestling with guestions people ask, in the hope that we will come to a better understanding of our world, a greater appreciation of the differences among religious people, and a stronger grasp of our own faith. This six-week study began on Sunday morning January 13th and will conclude on February 17th.

The study is based on a video series of the same name featuring the Reverend Adam Hamilton, founding pastor of the Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kansas.

This special church wide event includes worship & sermons at 9:30 a.m., and a small-group study that features videos, Bible study, and discussion at 10:45 a.m. in Fellowship Hall. Come and learn more about Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam, Judaism, and Christianity.

These religions will be explored with sensitivity and respect, always seeking to discern God's truth and grace for us. Churches often speak harshly and judgmentally about other faiths or ignore them, pretending that they do not exist. Neither is ultimately helpful.

Since the topic of religious diversity is of such great interest, we will be making an extra effort to invite the community to join us and we're asking members of the congregation to invite neighbors and friends.
