PASTOR'S NOTE

CONNECTED

One morning last week a person in our church community invited me to their home for coffee. To my surprise and ultimate delight, she had also invited a man who was a spiritual leader within the Lakota Indian Nation. The man did not identify himself as a medicine man, but it was apparent that he was a spiritual mentor and leader to his community.

As I listened to him discuss his "ministry" in the community and to Native Americans in prison, I became acutely aware that here was a man who shared my same concerns, values, passion and spiritual ideals.

He spoke of the spiritual traditions of his people and how often they were distracted by their lives from practicing those traditions. He also spoke of how all people are connected spiritually, both Indian and non-Indian.

I not only affirmed his words but felt a deep connection to this man I had just met. I was reminded that this connection is what our faith and our community is all about.

If you are reading this article you are on the mailing list of the Have-o-gram, but how connected are you to the church and the Havelock community? This connection comes in a variety of ways both to church and community: a fundraiser for children's recreational equipment or for a family financially and emotionally suffering from a tragic death or illness, a church council meeting where decisions are being made that will affect the future of the church community and it's outreach to the larger community, a small group where you can connect with God and neighbor and support one another in very intimate and needful ways, to mention a few.

Are you connected or are you distracted by the busyness of your life? I believe this connection is what Jesus was speaking of when he said, "The Kingdom of God is among you." We were made to be connected - we were made to be in community. Why not find your connection today?

Operating Rudget Needs Vear to Date for 2008

With 7 months of the year past we have met 27% of our apportionment obligation. Apportionments are paid to the annual conference and support the global and statewide ministries of the church including benefits for retired pastors and/or their surviving spouses.

The trustees have reported that the church must replace the flat roof over much of the church, as it cannot be repaired further. The current bids are between \$43,000 and \$48,000. The Board of Trustees and Finance Committee will meet to discuss how to raise money for this much needed repair project.
