PASTOR'S NOTE

ARE CHRISTIANS SUPPOSED TO GET ANGRY?

As part of my ministry I conduct an anger control group at a homeless shelter. Some of the people in my group have serious problems with their feelings of anger. Some have even ended up in jail or prison as a result.

I remember hearing a preacher once say, "Real Christians don't get angry!" After hearing this I was mad! God created us with all our feelings. None of them, including anger, are bad.

I do understand, however, why some people feel anger is wrong. I was raised in a home where my father was very frightening when he was angry. Someone always got hurt. I grew up with the false belief that anger was bad and if there was anger it meant someone was going to get it!

The Apostle Paul set the record straight in Ephesians 4:26 when he said, "Be angry and do not sin." Paul separated the feeling of anger from angry behavior.

Have you ever heard someone say, "That man or woman has a short fuse."? Usually that means that the person is explosive with their anger. Something happens and immediately they are acting out in anger.

When we are like that I don't believe our fuse is short, I just think we don't realize our fuse has been lit until it is too late. There are different levels of anger going from being mildly irritated to being in a rage. It is important to identify our feelings of anger as early as possible so that we can choose our response or behavior.

This can begin by accepting that we do have feelings of anger and that they are natural rather than denying them and stuffing these feelings. We don't have to let anger become sin or inappropriate behavior, especially if we identify it right away.

How can we know that we are getting angry? Usually there are cues that warn us, like our voice begins to shake or we get knots in our stomach. The point is that we can learn to identify and accept anger like any other feeling and then choose how we will respond. We need to do this before we reach the level of rage or explosive anger. No one needs to get hurt, including us, by our anger. We can be angry and not sin.
