The Havelock Community has drastically changed since many long-time members started attending the Havelock United Methodist Church. What once was a community of families supported by the railroad and Goodyear plant has morphed into a community with lower-cost starter homes and rental property. While the elderly make up a significant portion of our community, increasingly there are more young families in the community because housing is more affordable. Some of these families have significant need for support. How can we as a church respond to this need and be the "Good News" of the Gospel to them?

Well, we already have in many ways. The church has sponsored many events that are targeted for young families such as the Fourth of July Celebration, Halloween Event, family movies in the courtyard and fellowship hall. We are also aware that some of the families in our community are in distress. For many years we have offered quality food and clothing assistance in the community but in 2010 we are going to be able to take the next step. Havelock United Methodist Church in cooperation with Choices Treatment Center will be offering affordable professional counseling at the church for those in the church family and in the larger community as well.
