# HAVELOCK METHODIST CHURCH 1940'S AND 1950's

In 1940, Havelock church celebrated its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary with Rev. G.A. Moon as pastor. By this time, it was apparent that the church was in need of extensive repairs. The food concession at the State Fair was expanded to help raise funds. Because of Havelock's great expansion of industry and increase in population during this time, the plans for repairing the old church were abandoned and the money was saved for a new building.

In 1945, under the leadership of Rev. R.R. Kreps, a fund raising campaign was undertaken and preliminary plans were drawn up. The growing needs of the church soon made these plans inadequate also. Later in the Fall of 1950, under the leadership of Rev. Clarence W. Smith, a fund raising campaign was begun. A kickoff banquet for the campaign was held in the St. Patrick's Catholic Church across the street.

Approximately \$76,000 in cash and pledges was raised and planning began for the erection of a church school and fellowship section of the building while using the old sanctuary.

Ground was broken on March 30, 1952 and the cornerstone laid on May 4. After a summer filled with long hours of consecrated labor by many members and friends, it was decided that the needs of the church justified the construction of the entire building.

The last service in the old church was held August 24, 1952. The Fellowship Hall was used for church services, two identical services being held each Sunday, while the new sanctuary was being completed. The first service held in the new sanctuary was on December 21, 1952.

Much finishing work remained to be done on the inside. This continued for several years and was done by volunteer labor by the Men's group, church school

teachers, Women's Society and individuals. Even the children came to help in any way they could; some sanded woodwork.

In the northeast corner of the outside walls of the then sanctuary is a block of bricks which the children purchased at a cost of five cents each. Inside each brick is a slip of paper bearing the name of the purchaser.

Chairs and other equipment were financed by the various departments in many different ways. Little by little, the rooms became attractive and functional.

Later in 1959, the parsonage that had been purchased in 1922 at 6018 Kearney Avenue began showing its age. It had long been evident that the house was too small for most families. The church board voted to buy lots at the corner of Seward and 61<sup>st</sup> Street. The first occupants of the new parsonage were Rev. and Mrs. John E. Knight and their four young daughters. This parsonage was used until 2001. The Rev. Edgar Millican and wife, Jeanne were the last residents. The parsonage was sold and all pastors since have been paid a housing allowance and they find their own housing accommodations.
