AMY'S ADAGIO

I recently heard a sermon about the Last Supper from a perspective that I've never thought of before. I'd like to share it with you.

Imagine yourself in the Upper Room with Jesus and his disciples. The meal is almost finished. Thirteen people have enjoyed the Passover Feast.

Now imagine what your table looks like after a lot of people have finished eating. There are crumbs everywhere. There are spots on the tablecloth from where things have dripped. There might be a stain from where a glass of juice or wine was knocked over. The table that was once so beautifully set, is now a mess! That was what the table was like after Jesus and his disciples finished their meal.

And yet, in the middle of the mess, Jesus instituted what is now one of the sacraments of our church – Holy Communion. Something so beautiful occurred in the middle of a mess.

This is why our messes are sacred! This is why we never despair or give up hope – because beauty can come from the biggest of messes. We just have to be able to look past the crumbs and stains and know that the table will once again be set beautifully.

What are the messes in your life right now? Remember that there won't always be a messy table. And always keep hope that, out of the crumbs and stains, the beautiful and sacred arises.

FRESH START FALL OPEN HOUSE

Fresh Start's Fall Open House will be held on **Thursday, September 7**th **from 4:00-6:00 PM at 6433 Havelock Ave.** The Board of Directors invites the community to stop by for tours of the shelter, to enjoy appetizers and to learn more about the services offered by Fresh Start. **The Daisy Thrift Shop** will be open during the Open House. Take an advantage of our bonus day!

Fresh Start is a transitional shelter and goals program for women who are homeless. Residents identify and actively work on goals while living in our "home". All of their basic needs are provided, along with support from our team, who helps them on their path to self-sufficiency. Women may live at Fresh Start for up to one year, which gives them a longer time in a safe place to work on these goals.
