LOVING PRESENCE

August is full of life and energy. We can see that corn is growing so fast in the field. Our kids will start the new school year. Some will experience a big transition to upgrading their educational steps. What a wonderful transition for the high school seniors to be freshmen in college! It will be challenging for them but exciting to get into the new world at the same time.

It is also the time of coming back to ordinary life. Many families usually have a family vacation in June and/or July and get back to normal life in August. College students are also coming back to school.

I think that God gives us seasons because we don't usually like changes in our routines, but we may be able to start a new journey or restart a renewed ordinary life according to the season as a physical but also spiritual reminder. I hope August can be the time when we all may start a new spiritual journey with God or restart an ordinary track of our spiritual tradition.

It's been a long time since the pandemic broke out, and we have really struggled during that time with the sense of isolation and lots of disappointment with God for facing unexpected and unpleasant situations. So, maybe consciously or unconsciously, our faith journey has taken a passive track apart from the fellowship and presence of the church body, which was necessary for a while in this exceptional situation, the pandemic. Nonetheless, the thing is that this must be temporary. If not, we will consider this normal.

During the pandemic, what we have learned are three things.

- 1)God is always the same, staying with us and giving us His open arms. Look at the season and mother nature. The world is still going on under His providence.
- 2)Yet, the passive track of spiritual life that has been kept for a long time hinders us to discover and take joy and grace given by God. Remember that God never changes the amount of joy and grace that He prepares for us, but our physical and spiritual lifestyles have been changed, which has really affected our spiritual life.
- 3) Changing a passive track to the active track is harder than starting a new track from zero. This is because we feel that we are already doing something now for our spiritual journey.

We need to remember the fact that faith is fundamentally an active spiritual lifestyle with our free will. We would doubt whether the difference between active faith and passive faith is huge. In ordinary times, it looks the same. But, when we face crises, only those actively walking with God can change over the situation from impossibility to possibility, from despair to hope, from anxiety to joy, and from death to life.

Jesus says, "From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and the violent take it by force." (Matt 11:12, NRSV) God makes the final decision of salvation, but our free will is essential in the process. Paul guides this in a practical way to his young fellow, Timothy, "But as for you, man of God, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life, to which you were called and for which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses."(1 Timothy 6:11-12).

The way to heaven is made by God, but He never leads us by force. Choosing ways of life is our work. Why? If God decides everything in our life, what meaning does our life have? We are not a doll. He loves us as much as we are made of the image of God. So, he always lets us know the best way with ongoing support even though we do not want to follow His way sometimes.

I believe August can be the best time for us to take an action in our daily life to start a new spiritual journey with God or restart the ordinary track of our spiritual tradition. The Havelock United Methodist Church will be the place where you can get ongoing support for your journey with the presence of Christ and his church body.
